RELATION REQUESTS AT AN ALL TIME HIGH



REPORTS from the Foreign Office have revealed how the Imperial Government has recently been inundated with diplomatic requests. Seven micronations have requested relations with the Imperial Grand Duchy of Lundenwic. A treaty was signed between our nation and the Tower City State, now known as the Most Serene Empire of Azzurria. Yesterday, another two nations, the Khanate of Nedland and the Principality of Nossia were approved by

Imperial Grand Duchy had relations with the Khanate of Nedland before it became part of the Paravian Empire. The Principality of Nossia is a nation that donated a propaganda poster to the Imperial Government to help with the Lundener Civil War. The Foreign Office also recently announced a treaty had been signed with the Geovannian Empire. The Presidente Vitalicio, Generalissimo Gabriel De Geo even wore the Lundenwic badge that was gifted to him as he was photographed with the treaty. A new treaty with Karnia-Ruthenia was also announced. Although the treaty was officially sign on the 31st May and came into effect on that date, the Ministry of Foreign Affairs had waited until a copy of the treaty had been received in Karno-Ruthenia before announcing it. The treaty itself is just more comprehensive than the last and includes economical co-operation and non-aggression clauses. Gen. Lord Lewis, Marquis of New Charter said: "It is wonderful to see so many nations announcing their intentions to establish diplomatic relations with us. Although quite a few were turned down this time, should not put nations off from approaching our Foreign Office. However, I do encourage those who wish to pursue diplomatic relations to read our Foreign Policy first. Many of those rejected today were done so because they did not meet the strict criteria." The Marquis refused to reveal the nations that had been rejected claiming 'it is not in the interest of this Government to try to shame or belittle any nation. Now if you excuse me, my tea is ready.'
